Become a member of State Library of Queensland (it's free!).


Once you have joined State Library, <u>log in</u> to your account in <u>One Search</u> so you can use the links in this research guide to access the featured collection items.

State Library has a great selection of <u>eBooks on World War I</u>.






# **Featured Databases**

The <u>Britannica Library</u> has articles, images, videos, primary sources, eBooks and more on World War I with a selection of resources especially for teenagers.






